SAMPLE RESOLUTION

Committee Name (No Abbreviations)

Resolution Number

Sponsors: Official Names of the Sponsoring Countries (No More Than 5)

Signatories: Official Names of the Signatory Countries

The (name of the organ),

Recalling that there is no indentation before each perambulatory phrase,

Recognizing that one (1) line should be skipped after the title and before and after every phrase,

Expressing deep concern that delegates may forget to use a comma at the end of perambulatory phrases,

Recalling that perambulatory phrases CANNOT be amended,

Aware that the perambulatory phrases end in a comma before moving on to the operative phrases,

The (name of organ):

- 1. <u>Recognizes</u> that each operative clause ends in a semi-colon;
- 2. <u>Urges</u> that two (2) lines separate the perambulatory portion from the operatives;
- 3. Notes that each operative phrase is indented five (5) spaces;
- 4. <u>Welcomes</u> clear and simple working and splitting complex ideas into sub-operatives:
 - a. With a colon introducing the first sub-operative,
 - b. With one (1) line between the operative and first sub-operative,
 - c. With no underlining within the sub-operative,
 - d. With a comma at the end of each
- 5. <u>Observes</u> that a resolution, being only one sentence, always ends with a period.

Note: Before it is formally introduced, a Draft Resolution will be referred to as a Working Paper. The Working Paper will then be formally introduced to the committee as a Draft Resolution. Only after a Draft Resolution is voted upon and passed by the committee will it be referred to as a Resolution.
